FOREWORD

By its nature, the field of international relations necessitates collaboration among different communities, parties, and countries. These relationships—in seeking to address and resolve global issues—facilitate greater cooperation, information sharing, and resource pooling between actors at all levels and of all sizes. This is particularly critical, given the increasingly transboundary and existential nature of the issues our world faces: climate change, public health crises, economic inequality, and digitalization among them.

This awareness underpinned the founding of both the Harvard Undergraduate Foreign Policy Initiative (HUFPI) and the Sciences Po Policy Project (SP3). More specifically, HUFPI is a non-profit student-led organization connecting Harvard undergraduates of all identities and perspectives to the world of foreign policy decision-making. Its mission is to inspire, train, and prepare future generations of leaders in foreign policy, national security, intelligence, diplomacy, and defense; to this end, HUFPI undertakes a variety of projects, including policy projects with various government and private sector entities, speaker sessions, and foreign policy conferences for high school and college students. SP3, on the other hand, is France's largest student-led diplomatic network with the mission of preparing the next generation of international leaders via education at the source. Through travel, mentorship, research, and real-world policy writing, SP3 has been able to engage over 405 members in 7 cities—and that number is rapidly growing.

Recognizing the need for greater collaboration—between both current and future world leaders—in the international relations realm, HUFPI and SP3 established a joint Foreign Summit. Our overarching aim is to gather global leaders in diplomacy, foreign affairs, business, and international development to foster discussion of the matters to the relationship between France and the United States, as well as the broader international community. Alongside invited speakers and student delegations from our respective organizations, we will bring together students from across France and Europe to attend the conference and hear from experts about global issues ranging from media and technological development to defense and security. It is our hope that this Summit will inspire meaningful dialogue, discussion, and debate about the future of foreign policy—and, in so doing, emphasize the value of cooperation along the way.

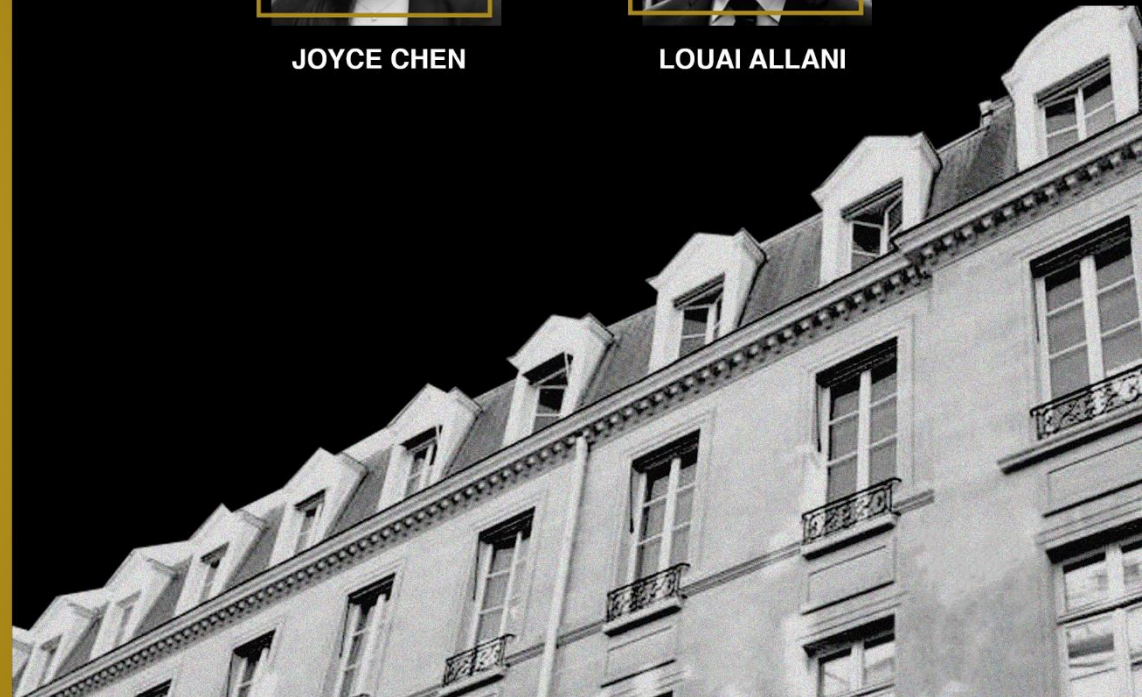

FEATURED SPEAKERS



H.E John Kerry

US Special Presidential Envoy for Climate (TBC)

Prior to serving as the United States' first Special Presidential Envoy for Climate, John Forbes Kerry assumed several key roles in American foreign policy, including as the Senate Foreign Relations Committee Chairman and as the 68th Secretary of State of the United States. As Chairman, Secretary Kerry assumed a leadership role on key foreign policy and national security issues facing the United States. He was instrumental in the ratification of the New Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty, the negotiation of the UN's genocide tribunal to prosecute war crimes in Cambodia, and major legislation on important global issues, including international drug trafficking, international money laundering, humanitarian aid, and climate change. As Secretary of State, John Kerry continued to guide America's strategy on nuclear nonproliferation, combating radical extremism, and the threat of climate change. His tenure was marked by the successful negotiation of the Iran nuclear deal and the Paris Climate Agreement.



H.E Karen Donfried

Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs

Karen Donfried is the Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. Previously, she served as president of the German Marshall Fund and as Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director for European Affairs on the National Security Council. She also worked for the U.S. Department of State's Policy Planning staff and served as National Intelligence Officer for Europe on the National Intelligence Council. Donfried holds a Ph.D and MALD from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy and is fluent in German. She has received several awards, including the Cross of the Order of Merit from the German Government and the Superior Honor Award from the U.S. Department of State.



H.E Nathalie Broadhurst

Deputy Permanent Representative of France to the United Nations

Nathalie Broadhurst took up her duties as Deputy Permanent Representative of France to the United Nations in New York, with the rank of Ambassador, on 27 August 2020. Since August 2015, she was Deputy Head of Mission at the Embassy of France to the United States in Washington, D.C., where she served several times as Chargé d'Affaires. Nathalie Broadhurst also has an extensive experience at the UN, as she has served in Paris, in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, as Deputy Director for United Nations, International Organizations, Human Rights and Francophonie from 2013 to 2015, and as head of division for Development Policies within the Directorate for Development and Global Public Goods, from 2010 to 2013. She has also served in Beijing twice as Second and then First Secretary (1998-2001; 2005-2009). Nathalie Broadhurst graduated from Sciences Po Paris and of the Ecole Nationale d'Administration. She has been made Chevalier of the National Order of Merit (Ordre National du Mérite) and Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur.



Dr. Fatih Birol

Executive Director, International Energy Agency

Dr. Fatih Birol is a well-respected energy expert with more than 30 years of experience in the field. Prior to his role at the IEA, he served as Chief Economist at the International Energy Agency and as an energy advisor to the World Bank and the OECD. He has also held various positions at the Turkish Ministry of Energy and the OPEC Secretariat. Dr. Birol has received numerous awards for his work, including the French Legion of Honour and the Turkish Republic Medal of Honour. He holds a PhD in Energy Economics from the Technical University of Istanbul and has published numerous articles and reports on energy issues. With new governments joining the IEA, under his tenure the Agency's share of global energy demand has risen from 40% to 75%.
