The Earth You Inherited

Monocultures, Landfills, and Eutrophication

We tend to speak about the environmental and climate crisis in global terms. But what does it look like here—in the landscape we move through every day?

In *The Earth You Inherited*, photographer Martin Kull explores three planetary boundaries through images from his immediate surroundings in Vaxholm. Bark beetle–infested spruce forests, disrupted landscapes, and eutrophic waters are set against images of his children and grandchildren within these environments. The intimate becomes a reflection of the global.

The 24 photographic works are presented in custom-made frames that deepen the dialogue with the planetary boundaries. A View-Master is also included, once a device for viewing the world in miniature, now a reminder of how we have looked without fully understanding.

The exhibition moves between documentary and a more poetic visual language, where the familiar is unsettled and loses its given meaning. The question that runs through the work is both simple and difficult to evade: what is it that we pass on?
